

The Big Political Sort

- To explain why the animosity in American politics is greater today than in the past, some researchers have focused on the nation's political "sorting"—the fact that Americans have shifted their allegiances so that the membership of each party is now far more uniform. In the past, each party had a mix of people who leaned conservative and liberal, of rural residents and urbanites, the religiously devout and those less observant.
 - Americans in the past were more likely to meet people different than themselves, which created opportunities for reducing group bias and creating conditions for compromise. Today, our partisan identities have come into alignment with the other facets of our identity, which heightens our intolerance of each other even beyond our actual political disagreements.



The Big Political Sort


- Decades of social science research shows that our need for collective belonging is forceful enough to reshape how we view facts and affect our voting decisions. When our group is threatened, we rise in defense.



Share of Americans who identify as conservative




Share of Americans who identify as Ilberal




The Big Political Sort

- The differences between the parties are clearer than before. Demographic characteristics are now major indicators of party preference, with noncollege white and more religious Americans increasingly identifying as Republicans, while Democrats now win most nonwhite voters and a majority of white people with a college degree.
- Multiple polls find that more than 70% within each party think the other party's leaders are a danger to democracy or back an agenda that would destroy the country.

- Workforce Development

Federal Tax Reform

- Make the Pass-Through Deduction Permanent to Ensure Certainty and Predictability
- Maximize the Value and Integrity of the New Deduction for Pass-Through Businesses
- Repeal the Estate Tax
- Repeal the Alternative Minimum Tax Make Remaining Tax Extenders Permanent
- **Contracting Reform**
 - Establish a statute of repose for federal construction projects
 - Ensure payment protections for construction subcontractors and suppliers performing federal construction under Public-Private Partnerships
 - Prohibit the utilization of reverse auctions for the procurement of construction contracts
 - Improve the design-build construction process
 - Ensure responsible contractors are given priority in the bidding process of federal contracts

On September 23, the Federal Acquisition (FAR) Council released the final rule implementing an ASA backed reform that will bring unprecedented transparency and accountability to federal agencies' change order processes. ASA, along with the Construction Industry Procurement Coalition (CIPC), successfully led the legislative effort to include these reforms in 2018 in the National Defense Authorization Act responsible for this final rule.

ASA Sponsored Change Order Legislation Becomes FAR Rule

Effective on October 28, this regulation applies to any federal solicitation for small business construction contracts and will require agencies to:

- Publish their policies and procedures for processing change orders (REAs);
- Begin to track the time it takes the agency to definitize change orders; and
- Publish this data on those solicitations and on a public website.

The new regulation will bring transparency to an issue that has long been costing federal contractors time and money. Federal agencies will have to focus on creating coherent policies and procedures for processing change orders.
